
Friday 19th July - End of Term (School Finishes at 1:30pm)

English

We are continuing to study different stories and writing stimuli that link with our History topic of WW2 and Conflict including the picture book, 'Rose Blanche'. For the second part of the term, we will be moving onto a story set in a contrasting warzone called, 'The Breadwinner.' Finally, to end



the year we will also be completing a transition unit of work. We will complete a range of writing around each story as well as

reading and SPAG activities. Finally, the children will also use a range of texts (including The Breadwinner) to answer VIPERS reading comprehension questions.

PE

Topic 1: Rounders We will be learning to apply rounders rules consistently, play small sided games using a standard pitch layout and we will use a range of tactics for attacking and defending in the role of bowler, batter and fielder. Mathematics

In this final half-term, we will be consolidating our knowledge learnt over the year so far as well as undertaking small projects which will provide pupils an opportunity to revisit many of the skills and curriculum content covered both in Year 6 and also the rest of Key Stage 2.

The projects have been designed to explore maths in real life contexts, allowing children to see how important maths is in all aspects of their life.

Finally we will also be focusing on mental

maths skills and arithmetic skills. In addition



RE

In line with the National curriculum, the children will be studying the topic of 'What place does religion have in our world today?'

DT- Electrical systems: Steady hand game

The children will be learning to understand what is meant by fit for purpose. They will be designing and developing a steady hand game using a series circuit (which links to our Science unit this half term).

MFL

In French this half term, the children will be learning to express basic opinions on food and clothing and they will be learning to make basic food orders in a café. They will also be learning about different occupations and they will be putting their French knowledge from the last 4 years together to write a letter to a French pen-pal.

Computing



This term in our computing lessons, we will be using Purple Mash to create picture based quizzes for young children. We will use the programme '2Quiz' to create a variety of guizzes, ending the unit by creating an, 'Are you smarter Unit: 6.7 than a 10-year-old' guiz for our parents and teachers! Quizzing

Our Jigsaw unit this term is: 'Changing Me'



Science

This half-term the children will be learning about electricity. The children will begin to understand why electricity is useful and the
