


### Believe, achieve, succeed Learning without limits

We will be using Class Dojo again this year. Parents will be able to see their child's dojo points and also have access to their child's Class Story and the School Story. The Class Story can only be seen by parents of the class. The School Story can be seen by all parents.

People outside of Stanburn Primary School cannot access our account. The Class/School Story might include pictures of the children working, children celebrating success or provide information for parents. Parents can like posts and can comment. Negative comments are not permitted and will be deleted.

Parents will also be able to message the teacher. Messages should be: short questions, information the class teacher needs to be aware of.

They should not be: complaints/serious concerns, requests for performance updates.

# YEAR 6 TRANSITION



The application for a secondary school place for September 2025 opened on 1 September and will close on 31st October 2024.

When you complete your application you can choose up to **six** schools. Before you proceed with the application you should:

- o find your nearest secondary schools
- find out how secondary schools places were allocated in previous years

Any applications submitted after 31 October 2024 will be considered late and will be processed in March 2025.




#### Reading in Year 6

Our mission at Stanburn Primary School is to teach every child to read – and to keep them reading, with no exceptions. Our children will learn to read with confidence, fluency and understanding, providing them with the skills required to achieve a lifetime of enjoyment through reading and reading lessons are prioritised across our whole school.

Whole Class Reading lessons take place daily in Year 6. Children are explicitly taught the skillr required for reading through the use of VIPERS (created by Rob Smith – The Literacy Shed).

Reading sessions take place 5 x a week for 30 minutes using specifically selected texts and the lessons are designed to help pupils master the reading skills needed in Year 6 and beyond. Our reading lessons are separate to but may complement other topics pupils are learning about. These lessons are also used to expose pupils to texts that broaden their knowledge of the wider world.





# The Reader Teacher Reads, Reviews & Recommendations!

#### Reading for pleasure in Year 6

We ensure our pupils develop a love of reading by introducing an exposing them to high quality texts each day during whole class reading and throughout the curriculum.

Our pupils will have the opportunity to visit our school library once a week where they can select and take home a high quality book to read for pleasure. These books are chosen independently by the child to help foster our children's love of reading and help them develop a daily reading habit.


#### How to support reading at home.




















#### How to support reading at home.

Daily reading practice will help develop children's fluency and comprehension skills, although it is not expected that each child will read a whole book every night. Children may only read a few pages, but will spend longer discussing their understanding of what they have read in order to progress in developing their comprehension skills. We want to encourage children to read a variety of texts on a regular basis, even taking opportunities to note and read texts in their environment such as leaflets, newspapers etc.

- We expect children in Year 6 to read for at least 20 minutes at home each day.
- Children will take home an independently chosen book from their reading corner or library to read for pleasure. Please support your child to write at least three comments a week in their reading records. This will be monitored by teachers.
- Please support children by making sure they write comments in their reading record at least three times a week. This will be monitored by the class teacher.
- Please ensure and support children to complete any other reading comprehension homework that is sent home by the class teacher.
- If you require any support please contact Miss Ciapryna who will be happy to help.


#### **Attendance and Punctuality**

# **Home Learning**

Children will be set home learning on Class Dojo every **Friday**. Maths homework is also set on MyMaths. Home learning is also recorded in the Home Learning book each week. The children are responsible for handing in their homework the following **Wednesday**.

#### **Spelling**

The children will also receive Spelling Homework each week on a Friday; their spelling test will take place the following Friday.

#### Reading

All children need to read for at least 20 minutes per night. They must write comments in their Reading Diaries 3 times a week and this must be signed by parents weekly. This will be checked every **week on a Wednesday**.

Home learning is checked every week. Any gaps in learning are addressed in class, group work or 1:1.

# **Assessment**

In May, all year 6 students nationally sit their SATs exams. Children will sit tests in SPaG, Reading and Maths which will run from Monday to Thursday. This year's assessment dates are:

Monday May 12<sup>th</sup> – Thursday May 15<sup>th</sup> 2025

There is no longer a formal writing test. Instead, every piece of writing in their English book is assessed to give a final grade.

At the end of the year, pupils will be given a scaled score and informed if they made the expected standard.

# Working in Partnership

#### Mobile Phones in Year 5 and 6

As pupils in Year 5 and 6 are allowed to walk home alone, we understand you may wish for them to have a mobile phone so you can contact them in an emergency. If this is the case, pupils must complete a 'parent permission form' and agree to the following:

- The school will not accept any liability for the phone should it get lost or damaged;
- The phone must be handed into the class teacher every morning so
  it can be locked away and collected at the end of the day;
- All phones must be switched off whilst on the school premises. This includes on the playgrounds before and after school;
- Under no circumstances are the children to use their phones outside the school for filming or photographing the school, children or adults;
- If my child is found to have been using their phone inappropriately they will not be allowed to continue bringing their phone to school.




# Communication
